There is concern of being overcommitted regarding the estimates that were made as to what La Junta would need and there is a need to have a knowledgeable, skilled person review La Junta’s commitments.

**C. Committee/Board Reports**

## 1. Utility Board (Council Member Velasquez):

- The Board approved an additional \$11,000 be appropriated to the electric fund.
- Also approved a wastewater rate increase from \$55 to \$58.50, effective May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Level 1 Water Restrictions. No watering between 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Avoid excessive water use.
- Some copper wire was stolen from the 600 block of Belleview.
- On the east side of town in dumpsters, they're finding human waste when they go to clean them out. A possible solution could be having a shared master lock.

## 2. Senior Center (Council Member Velasquez):

- Miss Elah Backes donated a new flower box as part of her Eagle Scout project and her family donated materials.

**E. Interim City Manager Comments**

- The 1% sales tax goes into the general fund not the enterprise funds. It is to build up the general fund for future projects.
- There were parking concerns at the Brick and Tile Park last weekend. Met with Brock and Martin to start looking into adding some parking west of the bathroom.
- There are currently 225 kids signed up for soccer. Just fifteen kids less than last year.
- Baseball sign-ups started today at the reduced fee.
- Cleaned up under the 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Adams bridge after the fire. Thanks to the Police Department and Street Department.
- Chief Todd Quick and Sheriff Shawn Mobley will be doing a "Grab-a-Cup-of-Coffee" at Copper Kitchen on Wednesday April 10<sup>th</sup> starting at 8:00 a.m.
- Repairs will begin tomorrow on the large water leak from last week. The public is asked to limit unnecessary water use, such as outside watering. If you notice discoloration after the repair, flush the cold-water lines in your house or business starting at the lowest level working to the tallest.

## ADDITIONAL TOPICS DISCUSSED:

- Tippy Martinez playground looking bad.
- There will be a general town hall toward the end of April.
- A homeless campfire was the cause for the fire under the bridge.
- There is an influx of abandoned shopping carts around town.
- The dog park is in the master plan; however, it is ranked as a low priority.
